Recipe: Teteh's Apple Pie


Ingredients:

²/₈ cups of sliced apples, peeled and cored. You will need 6-8 apples, depending on the size of the apple. Best to use tart apples (gravenstein, pippin or granny smith)
²/₃/₄ cup sugar (if you want it sweeter, use 1 cup sugar)
²/₃/₄ tsp. salt
²/₁ tsp. cinnamon- you can use less if you don't want a heavy cinnamon taste
²/₁ tblsp. lemon juice (you can use less if you want)

Instructions:

- 1.Mix together the filling ingredients and pour into your pie shell.
- 2.Fold in -- 1/4 to 1/3 cup flour to the apple
